

Do you know Wikipedia, the online encyclopaedia?

Wikipedia is a free encyclopaedia available on the Internet that anyone can edit. It is written collaboratively by its users and covers a wide range of topics (art, science, geography, history, famous people...). Wikipedia is available in many languages. If you have Internet access, you can explore the English version here: http://en.wikipedia.org/. The online English version counts over 3 million articles and is being constantly improved and updated.

This DVD represents an offline selection of about 47,000 articles taken from the online version of Wikipedia, from all subject areas. These articles from Wikipedia are therefore available even if you do not have an Internet access!

They were chosen in late 2010*, based on a combination of importance and quality. The technology behind this DVD is provided by Kiwix (http://kiwix.org/).

Here are some examples of what you can do with this DVD:

- Look up facts on any country of the world (presidents, peoples, languages ...)
- Read the biographies of a vast number of well-known people
- Discover new types of plants and animals
- · Learn the history of famous civilisations which have now disappeared

Where to start?

Insert the DVD into your disk drive. A window should pop up automatically asking you whether you want to launch Kiwix from the DVD or install it on your hard drive. Click on your selection. If nothing happens, you can start manually by clicking on the autorun.exe file in the autorun folder of the DVD.

When the main page is open, type a word or a group of words in the search field and press the button: a list of articles matching your research will be displayed! You can also click on any of the links (which appear in blue) in the alphabetical index to reach the list of corresponding articles.
